Professional (2003-present): Chris played for the Oakland Vipers in 2003 of the Golden State Amateur Football League for a single season, and he held the record for the most passing yards in a single game (471). He then played for the Eastside Hawks of the Northwest Football League (NWFL) in 2004 where he led the Hawks to a National Championship while winning the Championship Game MVP and league rookie of the year honors. Next Chris played for the Black Hills Red Dogs of the National Indoor Football League (NIFL) in 2005. Dixon then signed with the Billings Mavericks where he would play for five seasons, winning three championships and throwing 369 touchdowns. Upon the folding of the Billings franchise, Dixon signed with the Sioux Falls Storm for the 2011-12 seasons, where he won two championships in as many seasons. In 2012, Dixon signed with the Orlando Predators, it was the first time in Dixon's career that he played arena football instead of indoor football. He then went on to play for the New Orleans Voodoo in 2013. Chris returned to the Sioux Falls Storm for the 2014 season. Dixon came out of retirement to play for the Texas Revolution in 2017 to lead the Revolution to a CIF Championship. Chris returned to the Sioux Falls Storm late in the 2019 season.

- Dixon was a NAFL champion in 2004.
- He was the NAFL Championship Game MVP in 2004.
- Chris was the NWFL Rookie of the Year in 2004.
- He was a NIFL champion in 2006.
- Dixon was the UIF MVP in 2008.
- Chris is a six-time United Bowl champion (2009–2012, 2014, 2019).
- Chris is a three-time United Bowl MVP (2010, 2011, 2014).
- Chris is a three-time IFL MVP (2009, 2011, 2012).
- He is a four-time First Team All-IFL selection (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012).
- In 2012, Dixon threw his 500th career touchdown pass. With his 500th touchdown, Dixon became the 10th player to throw for a 500th touchdown at any professional level.
- Dixon earned Second Team All-IFL honors in 2014.
- Chris was the 2014 IFL Offensive Player of the Year.
- He was a 2015 IFL Hall of Fame inductee.
- Dixon was a CIF champion in 2017.

Junior-Senior (Humboldt State University, Arcata, CA, 2002-03): Dixon was a two time All-Conference selection and still holds the record for the most pass completions in a single game (41).
